Izola Bank p.l.c. First Half 2018 Results - Highlights

Review of Performance

- Profit before tax of €1,598,562 for the six months ended 30 June 2018 down €367,929 or 19 per cent, compared with €1,966,491 for the same period in 2017. This reduction is primarily the result of lower levels of other operating income, comprising mainly of gains on sales of investments.
- Operating income of €3,191,210 for the six months ended 30 June 2018, down €348,464 or 10 per cent, compared with €3,539,674 for the same period in 2017.
- The Bank's cost-to-income ratio increased to 50 per cent for the six months ended 30 June 2018, a deterioration of 6 percentage points, compared with 44 per cent for the same period in 2017.
- Loans and advances to customers (including factoring) of €127 million at 30 June 2018, up €13 million or 11 per cent, compared with 31 December 2017.
- Customer deposits of €142 million at 30 June 2018, down €3.5 million, or 2.3 per cent, compared with 31 December 2017.
- Total assets of €200.7 million at 30 June 2018, down €5.9 million, or 2.9 per cent, compared with 31 December 2017.
- Earnings per share of €2.72 for the six months ended 30 June were 15% lower than the earnings per share for the same period in 2017 (€3.21).

Commentary

The Bank experienced a reduction in its net interest income of 66 per cent when compared to the same period last year. This reduction is mainly due to decreased interest income from debt securities as a result of planned sales of Malta Government Stocks and reduced interest income on the lending portfolio.

On the other hand, net fee and commission income of €2,175,420 for the six months ended 30 June 2018 increased by €848,654 or 64 per cent, compared with 30 June 2017. This was due to an increase in factoring activity in Belgium and Malta.

Administrative and personnel expenses increased by 5.6% when compared to the same period last year however the variance between the Bank's other operating income during the first six months of 2018 when compared to the same period of 2017 of €614,745 resulted in a deterioration in the Bank's cost-to-income ratio of 6 percentage points from 44 per cent for the period ended 30 June 2017 to 50 per cent for the period ended 30 June 2018.

During the first six months of 2018 the bank increased its loans and advances to customers (including factored receivables) by €13 million or 11 per cent, and its investments were reduced by €10.6 million or 19 per cent, compared with 31 December 2017. The quality of the lending portfolio showed no sign of deterioration whilst liquidity and capital ratios remained substantially above regulatory requirements.

Basis of preparation

The condensed interim financial statements have been extracted from Izola Bank p.l.c.'s (the 'bank') unaudited management accounts for the six month period ended 30 June 2018. These condensed interim financial statements are being published in terms of Chapter 5 of the Listing Rules issued by the Listing Authority and in terms of the Prevention of Financial Markets Abuse Act, 2005.

The condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting standards adopted for use in the EU for interim financial statements (adopted IAS 34, 'Interim Financial Reporting'). They do not include all of the information required for full annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2017.

The accounting policies applied in these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those applied by the bank in its financial statements as at, and for the year ended, 31 December 2017 save for the adoption of IFRS 9, 'Financial Instruments' effective from 1 January 2018. The impact on the bank's interim financial statements as a result of this adoption did not result in a material change in either the classification and measurement of financial assets or the level of impairment provisions.

As required by the adopted IAS 34, 'Interim Financial Reporting', these interim financial statements include comparative statements of financial position information at the previous financial year end and comparative income statement information for the comparable interim period of the immediately preceding financial year.
