Over the years the Bank has expanded its line of business to offer easy-to-use online banking services to both corporate and personal clients in Belgium, France and Malta. Today, the Bank has furthered its development in factoring and niche lending services with the intention to expand further in the future.

A message from the CEO

I am pleased to present an overview of the Bank's performance for 2021.

The last year has certainly been another eventful one. Families and businesses continued to face struggles caused by the Covid-19 pandemic. Whilst encountering continued uncertainty around the pace and nature of the recovery, we saw the re-emergence of inflation and the eventual return of a rising interest rate environment. Closer to home, the inclusion of Malta in the Financial Action Task Force's list of jurisdictions subject to increased monitoring only continued to add to a background of uncertainty. Many were also confronted with new challenges driven by severe weather such as the devastation seen in Belgium last summer and the overall impact of climate change globally.

Challenges like these raise important questions about the future. Indeed, we are witnessing emerging insights about the resilience of businesses and banks which focus on good governance, support the environment and the communities they serve.

During the year ended 31 December 2021, despite all the global uncertainty, the Bank managed to generate growth in its revenue streams, increasing its net interest income by 11% over 2020 levels. Net interest income, which is a key indicator of the Bank's business performance, grew by €626,650 compared to the previous year. Coupled with growth in other operating income, this increase more than offset the rise in expenditure, resulting in a profit before tax for the year of €820,157; an increase of 36% on 2020. Profit after tax was €447,981, up 16% compared to the previous year.

The Bank's Cost-to-Income ratio decreased to 82% (2020: 87%), primarily due to the impact of an increase in overall operating income. This ratio remained relatively elevated owing to ongoing investment in technology, human resources and compliance. The total assets of the Bank increased by 3.3% to €402,420,451, mainly driven by an expansion in the loan and treasury portfolios. Factored receivables, a key component of the Bank's

business, declined marginally by 4%. This decline was mainly caused by an acceleration in the repayment of receivables which also results in improved credit quality.

As of the end of 2021, the Bank remained well capitalised and liquid with the Capital Adequacy Ratio (CAR) standing at 16.5% and a Liquidity Cover Ratio (LCR) of 1,320%, comfortably above European banking sector norms.

Our management team and staff have shown tremendous resilience over the last year; their hard work and resolve to support the Bank and its ambitions is unfaltering. I can't thank them enough for their dedication. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I would also like to thank our customers for their continued loyalty and support.

With the rising cost of living and especially the price increases of basic food items, I am also pleased to confirm our continued support of the Foodbank Lifeline Foundation. It has never been more important to ensure no person in our community should suffer the indignity of hunger.

The lingering effects of the pandemic and more recent geo-political developments, create significant uncertainty and have adversely impacted global commercial activities. The quantum of this ongoing impact on economic and market conditions and the shape and speed of an eventual recovery warrant that we approach the future with vigilance.




Revenues

Expenditure






The total assets of the Bank increased by 3% to €402,420,451, mainly driven by an expansion in the loan and treasury portfolios. Asset Country Mix




