Directors' Report Pursuant to Capital Markets Rule 5.75.2

The Directors present the unaudited condensed interim financial results of Izola Bank p.l.c. ("the Bank") for the period ended 30 June 2025.

The first half of 2025 marked a return to profitability for the Bank following a period of losses since 2022. Profit after tax amounted to €0.2 million compared with a loss of €1.2 million in the corresponding period of the prior year. This positive outcome reflects a combination of improved net interest income and continued progress on administrative cost control.

Net interest income increased by 30% year-on-year to €3.9 million (H1 2024: €3.0 million). This was primarily driven by a sharp reduction in interest expense, which decreased to €6.3 million (H1 2024: €8.1 million), while interest income declined to €10.2 million (H1 2024: €11.1 million). Fee and commission income remained modest at €47k, broadly in line with the prior period.

Operating costs continued to be tightly managed. Administrative expenses were significantly reduced, falling to €1.0 million from €2.1 million in H1 2024, reflecting the Bank's ongoing focus on efficiency. Employee compensation and IT expenditure were stable compared with the prior period, while depreciation and amortisation decreased in line with lower capital expenditure. These measures highlight the impact of the cost containment programme initiated in 2024, which is now translating into tangible financial results.

The Bank's balance sheet contracted in the period, with total assets decreasing to €462.2 million from €508.7 million at 31 December 2024. The reduction was primarily attributable to lower customer lending, with loans and advances to customers decreasing to €162.2 million (FY 2024: €194.0 million), reflecting subdued demand and a cautious approach to credit origination. Financial investments also declined to €78.3 million (FY 2024: €89.1 million), in line with liquidity and capital management priorities. Factored receivables remained broadly stable at €134.7 million (FY 2024: €138.2 million).

On the liabilities side, customer deposits decreased to €407.1 million (FY 2024: €448.6 million), underscoring the consolidation strategy that aligns with the strategic plan for 2025. The deposits portfolio experienced a reallocation towards shorter-term placements, thereby enhancing the Bank's funding efficiency and contributing to a more optimal cost of funding.

Debt securities in issue fell to €13.7 million (FY 2024: €16.8 million), reflecting the repayment of the €3,056,800 4.5% unsecured debt securities (ISIN: MT0000531211), which were fully redeemed on 30 June 2025. Equity strengthened marginally to €35.9 million (FY 2024: €35.6 million), supported by modest gains in reserves.

The Bank's CET1 ratio stood at 11.63% (Dec-2024: 12.71%), Tier 1 at 13.00% (Dec-2024: 14.20%), and the Capital Adequacy Ratio at 19.4% (Dec-2024: 21.15%).

Concluding statement

While the return to profitability reflects supportive market conditions and the dedication of our people, the Bank continues to operate in a challenging environment. Looking ahead to the remainder of 2025, the Bank remains focused on delivering value, following the successful completion of a key milestone in its digital transformation plan with the implementation of a new core and internet banking system. This strategic investment is expected to enhance customer experience further, streamline processes, and support ongoing operational efficiencies.

The outlook for the second half of 2025 remains cautious. After peaking in 2024, continued reductions in ECB interest rates are anticipated to lower the Bank's funding costs and expand its net interest margin, contributing to improvements in profitability and efficiency ratios. The Bank's priorities remain centred on the preservation of asset quality, strict cost discipline, and prudent liquidity management.

Statement Of Directors' Responsibilities Pursuant To Capital Markets Rules

The Directors are responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the condensed interim financial statements in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles of International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU and the presentation and disclosure requirements of IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting. In preparing the condensed interim financial statements, the Directors should:

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable; and
- Prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis, unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Bank will continue in business as a going concern.

The Directors are responsible for ensuring that proper accounting records are kept which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Bank. This responsibility includes designing, implementing and maintaining such internal controls as the Directors determine are 0 necessary to enable the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. The Directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Bank, and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to the Condensed Interim Financial Statements

1. Reporting entity

Izola Bank p.l.c. (the "Bank") is a credit institution domiciled and incorporated in Malta with its registered address at 4, Castille Place, Valletta, VLT1062, Malta.

The Bank's ESEF Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2024 are available for viewing on the Malta Stock Exchange's website (the officially appointed mechanism) at https://borzamalta.com.mt/, on the Bank's website at www.izolabank.com, or upon request from the Bank's registered office.

2. Basis of preparation

2.1 Statement of compliance

The financial information of Izola Bank p.l.c. as at 30 June 2025 and for the six-month period then ended reflects the Bank's financial position and performance.

These unaudited interim condensed financial statements are being published in accordance with Capital Markets Rule 5.74 issued by the Malta Financial Services Authority (MFSA) and the Prevention of Financial Markets Abuse Act, 2005. They have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 – *Interim Financial Reporting*, as adopted by the EU. As required by IAS 34, these financial statements include comparative information:

- the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2024,
- and the statements of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, changes in equity, and cash flows for the six-month period ended 30 June 2024.

The accounting policies, presentation, and methods of computation used in preparing these interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those applied in the Bank's most recent audited annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024. As such, these interim statements do not include all the disclosures required for annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the Bank's audited financial statements for the year then ended. These interim results are intended to provide an update on material events and transactions occurring since year-end.

In line with Capital Markets Rule 5.75.5, the Board of Directors confirms that these interim financial statements have not been audited or reviewed by the Bank's independent auditors in accordance with International Standards on Auditing or ISRE 2410 *Review of Interim Financial Information*, respectively.

2.2 Basis of measurement

These financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis, except for:

- Financial investments measured at fair value through other comprehensive income ("FVOCI");
- Financial investments designated at FVOCI or at fair value through profit or loss ("FVTPL"); and
- Property within 'Property and equipment' and 'Investment Property held for sale' measured at revalued amount and fair value, respectively.

2.3 Functional and presentation currency

These financial statements are presented in Euro (€), which is the Bank's functional currency.

3. Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In the preparation of these financial statements, the use of certain accounting estimates is required. In this respect, management is required to exercise their judgement in the process of applying the Bank's accounting policies. This requires assumptions to estimate the carrying amount of assets and liabilities, as well as the recognition of income and expenses. Due to the inherent uncertainty and high level of subjectivity involved in making such judgements, actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to estimates are recognised prospectively.

4. Material accounting policies

The material accounting policies applied in these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those applied by the Bank in its financial statements as at, and for the year ended, 31 December 2024. The IASB has published a number of minor amendments to IFRSs that are effective from 1 January 2025, which have been endorsed by the EU, and other minor amendments to IFRSs that are effective from 1 January 2025, which have not yet been endorsed by the EU. The changes resulting from the above standards, interpretations and amendments do not have a material impact on the Bank in the current or future reporting periods and on foreseeable future transactions.

6. Fair values of financial assets and liabilities

The Bank's financial investments within the Statement of Financial Position are mainly measured at fair value, except for a separate group of local sovereign bonds, which are measured at amortised cost. The Bank is required to disclose fair value measurements according to the following hierarchy:

- Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets (Level 1).
- Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset either directly i.e. as prices, or indirectly i.e. derived from prices (Level 2).
- Inputs for the asset that are not based on observable market data i.e., unobservable inputs (Level 3).

As of 30 June 2025, and 31 December 2024, investments were principally valued using Level 1 inputs.

No transfers of financial instruments measured at fair value between different levels of the fair value hierarchy have occurred during the interim period under review.

The fair value of the local sovereign bonds measured at amortised cost amounted to €44,261,475 (2024: €43,704,546) compared to a carrying amount of €51,153,981 (2024: €51,219,171). The fair values of all the Bank's other financial assets and liabilities that are not measured at fair value but instead measured at amortised cost approximate their respective carrying values.

The valuation techniques utilised in preparing these condensed interim financial statements were consistent with those applied in the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024.

Debt securities in issue as at 30 June 2025 and 31 December 2024 amounted to €14,000,000 and €17,056,800, respectively. The balance as at 31 December 2024 included €3,056,800 of 4.5% unsecured debt securities (ISIN: MT0000531211), which were fully redeemed on 30 June 2025. The remaining €14,000,000 comprises of 5% unsecured subordinated bonds (ISIN: MT0000531229), maturing on 15 September 2032, with an early redemption option exercisable by the Bank on 15 September 2027 and annually thereafter.

The Bank has not had any defaults of interest or any other breaches with respect to these debt securities during the financial period ended 30 June 2025 and the year ended 31 December 2024.

8. Property and equipment, Investment Property held for sale and intangible assets

During the six months ended 30 June 2025, additions of €166,998 (six months ending 30 June 2024: €747,271) in property and equipment and additions of €777,717 (six months ending 30 June 2024: €781,828) in intangible assets were made.

As at 30 June 2025 and 31 December 2024, the Bank's property classified within 'Investment Property Held for Sale' comprises two adjacent and prestigious houses located at Nos. 53–58, East Street, Valletta, in proximity to the Lower Barrakka Gardens and enjoying views of the Grand Harbour and the Three Cities. These eighteenth-century buildings are structurally sound and finished to a high standard. The properties previously housed the Bank's offices until June 2024, as communicated in Company Announcement No. 118 issued on the Malta Stock Exchange on 21 June 2024. Following management's assessment that the criteria for classification as held-for-sale were met, the properties were transferred to 'Investment Property Held for Sale' as at 31 December 2024. During August 2025, the Bank's Board of Directors approved a resolution to extend the Promise of Sale agreement (Note 16).

9. Related parties

9.1 Identification of related parties

Related parties of the Bank include the ultimate parent, all entities controlled by the ultimate parent, key management personnel, close family members of key management personnel and entities which are controlled or jointly controlled by key management personnel or their close family members.

Key management personnel are defined as those persons having authority and responsibility for planning, directing and controlling the activities of the Bank, being the directors and the Bank's executive management. Reference to executive management shall mean the CEO, the Head of Finance & Treasury, the Head of Strategy and Value, the Head of Operations, the Head of Credit, the Head of Business Development, the Head of IT, the Head of Risk and Compliance and the Head of HR.

The Bank's immediate parent is IBL T Limited, the registered office of which is 4, Castille Place, Valletta, VLT1062, Malta. The financial results and assets and liabilities of the Bank are included in the consolidated financial statements of Carlenco Finance NV, with registration number 0755.471.533, the registered office of which is Lar Blok Z5, 8511 Kortrijk, Belgium.

Caroline Van Marcke and Magdalena De Roeck have an indirect beneficial interest in the shareholding of the Bank and have significant control in the ultimate parent.

11. Income tax credit

Income tax credit is recognised in each interim period based on the best estimate of the weighted average annual income tax rate expected for the full financial year.

12. Earnings per share

Earnings per share were calculated by dividing the profit/loss after tax attributable to ordinary shareholders of the Bank totaling to €215,929 (June 2024: loss of €1,244,142) by 58,000,000 ordinary shares as at 30 June 2025.

13. Share capital and Accumulated Losses

At 30 June 2025 and 31 December 2024, the authorised and issued share capital comprised 120,000,000 and 58,000,000 ordinary shares of €0.50 each respectively. The holders of ordinary shares are entitled to receive dividends as declared from time to time and are entitled to one vote per share at shareholders' meetings of the Bank.

Accumulated Losses as at 30 June 2025 is inclusive of €1,520,564 (2024: €1,514,715) set aside for the Depositor Compensation Scheme. This represents funds with the Central Bank of Malta and pledged in favour of the Depositor Compensation Scheme.

14. Asset Encumbrance

Banking Rule 07 transposed the provisions of the EBA Guidelines on Disclosure of Encumbered and Unencumbered Assets (EBA/GL/2014/03) and introduced the requirement to disclose information about asset encumbrance.

This disclosure is meant to facilitate an understanding of available and unrestricted assets that could be used to support potential future funding and collateral needs. An asset is defined as encumbered if it has been pledged as collateral against an existing liability, and as a result is no longer available to the Bank to secure funding, satisfy collateral needs or be sold to reduce the funding requirement.

The disclosure is not designed to identify assets which would be available to meet the claims of creditors or to predict assets that would be available to creditors in the event of a resolution or bankruptcy.

Izola Bank does not encumber any collateral received. As of 30 June 2025, the Bank did not have any outstanding liabilities associated with encumbered assets and collateral received.

The Bank undertakes the following types of encumbrances:

- i. Pledging of a deposit with the Central Bank of Malta in favour of the Depositor Compensation Scheme.
- ii. Pledging of Malta Government Stocks held in terms of Directive No. 8 (Chapter 204 of the Central Bank of Malta Act) as security for access to the Central Bank's Main and Long-Term Refinancing Operations (MROs and LTROs respectively) not currently being utilised.

16. Subsequent events

During August 2025, the Bank's Board of Directors approved a resolution to extend the Promise of Sale agreement between the Bank and the purchaser for the property classified under Investment Property held for sale. The signing of the final deed is now expected to be concluded by the end of August 2027.
